- AN ACT Relating to the existence of the Supreme Ruler of the Universe; and adding a new chapter to Title 1 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- Sec. 1. (1) The purpose of this act is to defend 4 NEW SECTION. the liberty of the people of the state of Washington. According to the founding documents of our democratic society, the United States 6 Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United States, and 7 the Constitution of the state of Washington, the purpose of our 8 government is to secure the liberties of the people which are governed. 9 According to these documents, our liberties have been endowed by a 10 higher power. 11
- (2) This act is not about morality, or personal faith, or freedom of 12 thought. It is not about what individual citizens choose to believe or 13 disbelieve. It is not about repealing the First Amendment, denying the 14 citizens of this state their constitutional right to free speech, 15 prohibiting the free exercise of religion, or respecting an 16 establishment of religion. It is not about limiting the rights of 17 individual citizens; rather, it is about requiring our government to do 18 its job, to protect our liberty, a liberty which has been endowed by our 19 Creator, the one responsible for Blessing us, The Supreme Ruler of the 20 21 Universe.
- 22 (3) According to the founding documents of our democratic society, 23 the stated purpose of our government is to secure the liberties of the 24 people which are governed.

(a) Paragraph two of the United States Declaration of Independence states, "That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed."

- (b) The preamble to the United Sates Constitution states, "We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."
- (c) Section one of the Constitution of the state of Washington states, "All political power is inherent in the people, and governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed, and are 36 established to protect and maintain individual rights." 37
 - (4) According to the founding documents of our democratic society, our liberties have been endowed by a higher power.
 - (a) Paragraph two of the United States Declaration of Independence states, "WE hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness"
 - (b) The preamble to the United States Constitution states, "We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."
 - (c) The preamble to the Constitution of the state of Washington states, "We, the people of the State of Washington, grateful to the Supreme Ruler of the Universe for our liberties, do ordain this constitution."

In this nation, it is WE, the people, who are sovereign. Our government has been instituted among us, with our consent, for the purpose of protecting and maintaining our liberties. According to the founding documents of our democratic society, our liberties are true and valid because they are endowed by a higher power. By contending that a higher power does not exist, our government removes the source of, invalidates, and consequently denies we the people of the United States, our liberty. Thus, by denying the existence of a higher power our government defeats its purpose. It is therefore, unconstitutional for the government, as opposed to the individual citizens, of the state of Washington to deny or attempt to refute the existence of the Creator,

- 66 the one responsible for Blessing us with liberty, the Supreme Ruler of 67 the Universe.
- 68 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 70 (1) "Circulated document" means any flyer, brochure, or pamphlet 71 that is used to convey procedures, facts, or ideas.
- 72 (2) "Display" means any sign, billboard, advertisement, 73 announcement, or other posting.

- (3) "Exercise" means any activity or operation designed to test or train State Employees, members of the State armed forces, elected officials, or students enrolled in the public schools, including both public schools as defined in RCW 28A.150.010 and state colleges and state and regional universities as defined in RCW 28B.10.016.
- 79 (4) "Higher power" means a form of existence that is above that of 80 human being.
- 81 (5) "Instruction" means any teachings, lessons, set of objectives, 82 or curriculum.
- (6) "Public entity" means any organization, corporation, company, 83 84 partnership, association, trust, foundation, fund, club, society, committee, political party, board, commission, agency, independent 85 office of this state, political subdivision of any county, city, town, 86 municipal corporation, school district, public educational institution, 87 or any group of persons, whether or not incorporated, permanently or 88 temporarily associated together for joint action or advancement of views 89 on any subject or subjects that is receiving public moneys or property. 90
- 91 (7) "Public moneys" has the same description as all moneys 92 described in RCW 43.79.010.
- 93 (8) "Public properties" has the same description as "lands" 94 described in RCW 79.02.010.
- 95 (9) "Research project" means any form of studious inquiry, 96 investigation, or experimentation.
- 97 (10) "Scientific endeavor" means any act, idea, theory, 98 intervention, conference, organization, or individual having to do with 99 science.
- 100 (11) "Textbook" means any book or book substitute, limited to books,

- 101 reusable workbooks, or manuals, whether bound or in loose leaf form,
- 102 intended for use as a principal source of study material for a given
- 103 class or a group of students, a copy of which is expected to be
- 104 available for the individual use of each pupil in such class or group.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Without denying the citizens of this state their constitutional liberties, the government of the state of Washington may not use public funds to deny or attempt to refute the existence of the Supreme Ruler of the Universe.
- (2) Respecting no establishment of religion, yet with respect to the 109 Supreme Ruler of the Universe, whose existence has been declared in the 110 preamble to the Constitution of the state of Washington, the state shall 111 make no appropriation for nor apply any public moneys or property in 112 support of anything, specifically including, but not limited to, any 113 display, exercise, instruction, textbook, scientific endeavor, 114 circulated document, or research project which denies or attempts to 115 refute the existence of the Supreme Ruler of the Universe. 116
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) In compliance with Article II Section 19 of the Constitution of the state of Washington, and as it relates to the scope and manner of this act, this chapter presently contains no additional provision for crimes, punishments, or enforcement proceedings. However, citizens, elected officials, and officers and employees of the public entities of this state are mutually responsible for upholding the requirements of this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit or infringe upon religious freedom within the meaning and the manner guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States or the state of Washington.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to authorize, require, or establish any military or civilian censorship or in any way to limit or infringe upon freedom of the press or freedom of speech or assembly within the meaning and the manner as guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States or of the State of Washington.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The provisions of this chapter are to be liberally construed to effectuate the intent and purpose of this act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. If any provision of this act or its
- 137 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder
- 138 of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or
- 139 circumstances is not affected.
- 140 NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. This act may be known and cited as the
- 141 Washington state defense of liberty and the existence of a higher power
- 142 act.
- 143 NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. Sections 1 through 9 of this act
- 144 constitute a new chapter in Title 1 RCW.
